RECTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Saints of St. John's,

Do you feel it? Do you feel as though St. John's is having a Pentecost moment where the Spirit is present in exciting ways? I sure feel it.

Your participation in Pack-the-Church Sunday was phenomenal and you've kept attendance high ever since. The billboard was the talk of the town (and will return from August to October) and a visit by a local blogger about Lynchburg Churches gave us some great PR on social media. We have a large Confirmation class while

youth group and Sunday School attendance is also up. Chapel Chat, Adult Forum, and Wednesday Lenten Suppers are also enjoying increased attendance. We have a solid group of Morning Prayer attendees, including some from outside our parish. The work on the new property (I'm refusing to call it "the bank" any longer) is progressing and you'll soon see construction activity for the new playground. Young families, especially from the Day School, are continuing to accept our invitation to join the parish!

These exciting trends empower you to do the work that God has called you to do in the world. The Spirit of Christ flows through these experiences here, and from here you are being sent into the world to bless the world in the name of Jesus. Our church is not a closed system, but an open and loving community that seeks to bring Christ wherever we go.

These are, without a doubt, exciting times. Yet, as I sit in Vestry and Stewardship meetings, there is a strong undercurrent of anxiety about our finances. My faith is in the Lord. And my trust is in you. An increase of 11% by every pledging unit would put us on terra firma - solid ground. Those increases can begin this year if you're able. And, please, don't forget to include St. John's in your estate planning. These are all things we've talked about before, but now is the time of urgency and action.

During this time of Lenten sacrifice, we look towards the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ at Easter and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Similarly, during this time of financial sacrifice, we look forward to a day of joy without financial anxiety so that we can do the things God is calling us to do.

Through faith, prayers, and contributions, you can help us help you help the world.

ASSOCIATE RECTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Siblings in Christ,

What is pilgrimage? a Pilgrimage is an experience, a journey, that involves a new or expanded understanding of self. others, and God. From the very beginnings Christianity, pilgrims went to Jerusalem to walk the way of the cross—Jesus' journey from his triumphal entry, through crucifixion. into



resurrection. This journey was how the first Christians understood the faith in a tangible way—and it has been passed down in the way our Gospels were written, the church year and our Holy Week customs set into stone, and in a special liturgy called the **Way of the Cross**.

This Lent, we will celebrate Holy Week in full as we do each year beginning with Palm Sunday, through Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. If it is possible for you to attend any of these services, or stream them online, I highly encourage you to do so. Holy Week, especially the Triduum (Maundy Thursday-Easter) are the three holiest days in the Christian year. Our service times and information can be found on the front page of this edition of the *Tidings*!

We also will offer **Stations of the Cross** for the first time in several years on March 22 at 5:30p. This service of scripture readings, musical responses, and prayer will allow us to tell the story of Jesus' last week in a different way than reading the passion on Palm Sunday or attending the liturgies. Many Christians pray through the stations each Friday in Lent; my prayer is that it will be another option to enhance your understanding and prayer life as you get ready for Holy Week. We will not stream it since we will be "moving locations" several times during the liturgy—but we will have seating at all four locations, and it should be accessible to all our parishioners who desire to attend. **Join us this year for these special services!**


