MESSAGE FROM THE REV. CHRIS ROUSSELL, RECTOR

Dear Saints of St. John's,

A blank page. A flashing cursor. My mind filled with so many things to write about this month. Often, the subject of these letters to you comes quickly and specifically. But, here in the first week of November, my mind is cluttered with a thousand things I could write to you.

Giving thanks is always appropriate at this time of year. Of course, that can quickly lead to a reminder of the importance of our weekly Thanksgiving – the Eucharist. Perhaps a reminder of our mid-week Eucharist on Wednesdays at 12:10 p.m. and a challenge for you to join our dedicated group.



Just over the horizon is December. Do I write about the special services coming up? The Annual Meeting on December 3, with a combined service at 9:45 a.m., as well as the unique situation this year where Advent 4 and Christmas Eve fall on the same day, or the fact that New Year's Eve falls on a Fifth Sunday – yet another combined service at 9:45 a.m.? Perhaps that can wait until next month.

My mind always drifts towards a message about Jesus Christ whom I adore and worship alongside you. Without him, we would not be here together. Do I write of the time as a freshman in college when I had an hours long argument with Jesus and how that drew me closer to him? Or my 36-day silent retreat in 1999 where I got to experience the human side of Jesus? Or how I saw him in one of you this week?

Perhaps I should share my recent experiences of connecting with the Holy Spirit during my prayer time. My acknowledgement of the Spirit's presence at St. John's these days sounds like a broken record in my head, but maybe it needs to be said over and over again.

Or I could simply express the deepest gratitude that Alison and I feel to be part of your lives – and you as part of ours.

The truth is that I'm not quite sure what our Lord Jesus Christ through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit wants me – as your pastor – to say to you. How do I simply say "thank you and keep doing what you're doing, because you're doing it so well"?

The page is now filled with a blast of ideas all over the place. Yet, they originate from one place: my heart.

he Stewardship season allows each of us to consider our giving and the priority we place on the mission and work of St. John's in our lives. A sincere thank you to those of you who have already submitted a Stewardship pledge this year, and for those of you who have not yet had a chance to pledge there is still time!!

Your annual pledge allows the Vestry to approve a budget each December to support our ministries, facilities, and staff for the coming year. Historically, we receive about 2/3rds of the pledges by Pledge Sunday in October, and continue to receive pledge commitments through the year, with the reality that the budget will be based on the totals reached in early December.



This year, as of Pledge Sunday on October 15th, we received 141 pledges totaling \$635,626. As a comparison, by December of last year we collected 208 pledges for a full year total of \$816,339.

While our year-to-date totals are comparable to last October, we pray that by December we will exceed last year's totals to meet the needs of our growing and vibrant church community. The Stewardship Committee will be working over the next several weeks to increase the pledge numbers.

As Chris mentioned in his Stewardship letter to the congregation, the St. John's Annual Budget has been nearly the same for 20 years and even as inflation and expenses have risen, our income has not kept pace.

Exciting things are taking place at St. John's and by combining our gifts we can make a meaningful difference together. Please contact any member of the Stewardship Committee with any questions or concerns.

ASSOCIATE RECTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I can't believe it is almost Advent! As we wrap up our November classes, I am excited for "Christ the King Sunday" after two weeks of deep study on this topic. I know that our recent Bible studies have enriched the Sunday morning worship for me and for those who have participated. Will you join us this December for a Bible Study, Adult Forum, or Morning Prayer in Advent to prepare for Christmas?

Our next Bible Study will be another special focus as we dive into the topic of Incarnation. Join us as we examine both Old and New Testament to understand why Jesus became human, and what difference the incarnation makes. Often, Episcopalians and Anglicans alike place a large emphasis in their theology on "incarnation;" so it is fitting that we begin to unpack that term with a Bible Study. Classes will be at 11:00a on Wednesday Nov 29, December 6, and December 13.



Our Adult Forum in Advent will meet December 10 and 17 for a two-part conversation on John the Baptist. We will explore John's story through scripture and discuss how we are called to be like John in pointing the way to Jesus Christ. This class will be a mix of lecture and discussion.

Finally, Morning Prayer returns via Zoom Monday-Friday December 4-22 at 8:00a. We have a faithful group who attend this prayer daily and experience it as a transformative practice. Start your day with 20 minutes of prayer in community from wherever you are. Even if you cannot join every day, choose one day of the week and join us 3 times over the 3 weeks. I look forward to this prayer so much during Advent and Lent; so I hope you will make plans to join us!

We thank each of you for the impact you all have on our school and we wish you all a wonderful season of gratitude.








St. John's Day School Book Fair November 26-December 1
