MESSAGE FROM THE REV. CHRIS ROUSSELL, RECTOR

Dear Siblings in Christ,

In 2018, I was part of a delegation of Episcopal priests, bishops, and laity who visited Israel and Palestine. The purpose of the trip was to gain a clearer understanding from both sides of the conflict in the region. We met with a variety of representatives, including a former member of Israeli parliament, the press secretary of the PLO, a Muslim family in their home, a Palestinian journalist residing in Israel, and the retired bomb scene investigator for the Israeli police force. Hearing from both sides of the conflict helped us understand the complexity of the history between the two sides.



We also met with an Israeli military official. He was an attorney by trade and was one of many who were charged with investigating any Palestinian death at the hands of an Israeli soldier. Who gave the order? What was the provocation? Who pulled the trigger? We were told that Israel's military actions are guided by Jewish Law. "Though shall not murder" is an important guiding post, so the investigation into whether a justifiable killing like self-defense had to take place or not is investigated thoroughly.

The Palestinian Muslims we met with were peaceful people whose faith is much like ours – rooted in love and generosity. Imagine their horror when radicals hijack their Koran to justify such brutality and bloodshed, just as we reel back in horror when Christians use Scripture to justify hate or bigotry. We must remember that those who have brought this evil into the world do not represent either the entire Muslim world or actual Muslim beliefs.

While in Jerusalem, we also met with the Reverend Hosam Naoum of the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. He is now the archbishop there. He explained the difficulties of being a Christian minority in a predominantly Jewish and Muslim area. During this time of war, I ask that you keep Archbishop Naoum and his flock in your prayers.

Let us pray that the war ends now. Let us pray for peace. Let us pray for evil to be vanquished. Let us pray for the dead, the missing, the hostages, and the survivors who are left to deal with the trauma inflicted upon them. Let us pray for our Jewish, Muslim, and Christian brothers and sisters in the region who are innocent victims of this violence.

It is an exciting time to be at St. John's. As I settle into my new role, I look around at all of you, from newcomer to lifelong member, and am in awe. We have a wonderful parish, and a wonderful, growing community. This is true, and there is work to be done.

Our faith is never finished. This November, we have some exciting formation opportunities for you as we continue to grow into our full stature as

Christians. In Adult Forum, we'll have a series answering a much-asked concern. Daily Bread: Many thanks to Molly Jenkins the awesome organizer, who recruited Bill Burruss, John Morgan, Laura Morgan, Sallie Rabe, and Chris Roussell to join me on September 19. Please read the letter below from Jennifer McCarthy of Daily Bread and St. John's:

It was great to see familiar faces at Lynchburg Daily Bread on September 19! I wanted to pass along information about what was accomplished that day because of Outreach support from St. John's. 795 meals were prepared and served to guests at Clay Street. Another 64 meals were prepared for outreach sites, including our St. John's neighbors at Miriam's House, along with 15 meals for the Monacan Nation Elder lunch program. Volunteers provided staff "free hands" to manage our free weekly produce market, provide produce and grocery boxes for Bedford YMCA preschool program, Joseph's Dream, Free Clinic of Central VA, Roads 2 Recovery, and Revival Fellowship of Gladys, unload and sort donations, fill buckets with food scraps for Lynchburg Grows to compost, and prep for the next day. PROJECTS THAT YOU CAN BE A PART OF:

Camp Kum-Ba-Yah: We plan to paint the rope shed, clean up around the area, and work on weeding the amphitheater. The Youth Group will join at Camp Kum-Ba-Yah— youth, please sign up with Lalla Johnson!

St. John's Day School: This year we are partnering with NoWalls Holy Rollers to paint our large multi-purpose room at the Day School! NoWalls and some St. John's volunteers primed the room on October 7; St. John's volunteers will paint the room on October 21.




